I think it's a safe bet now pretty much everyone, unless you have literally not stepped off your property in the last 4 weeks, has seen someone wearing a mask of some sort. Seeing it on TV is one thing, but seeing the person standing next to you in line at the grocery store (or wherever), wearing a mask does something to you. You wonder...the normal clues we receive through facial expressions are partially blocked. Are they nervous? Are they sick? If it's someone you know, it helps, but even then you look harder at their eyes and listen closer to their voice.

And what if that person is you? Over the past few weeks, especially if you have any reason to believe <u>your</u> health might be compromised, wearing a mask becomes something you think you, and everyone else, must do, regardless of how hot or uncomfortable it can become.

And depending on where you go now, those with-<u>out</u> masks are becoming the minority. And then it's just a short skip and hop to the "mask-less" becoming the "new leper", a pariah to be avoided and shunned. It's amazing how quickly things change.

In a public crisis event, like what we are experiencing now, it is astonishing how quickly and how much, **fear**, (unfounded or not) enters into our thinking and influences our decisions. (Do I have to remind anyone about our TP status?). Even when we intentionally strive to think rationally and even faithfully, we never fully remove the push of fear. And when fear has a face, either with or without a mask, we can find ourselves putting more than just 6 feet of distance between us and another human being.

Part of what stood out for those who witnessed Jesus' ministry on earth was His willingness to see lepers as more than just a disease, a threat, and to act with compassion; approaching to within "6 feet" and touching them when no one else would. Remember, the lepers in Jesus' day were required to shout "Leper!" wherever they went so others could avoid them. With or without masks, it seems we don't have to shout anymore.

Don's misunderstand me here. For the time being we do need to be extra sensitive and careful about how we interact with others. We cannot afford to be cavalier, but can we afford to let fear override our compassion we say we get from Jesus?

I'm not saying this is easy. Jesus never promised us a cross-less faith. But maybe those masks we are seeing now in ever increasing numbers may help us see the face of Jesus a little bit more in others...<u>if we look</u>. I know it helps, when we accept more and more Jesus into our own lives, to enable others to see Jesus in us.
