So, what are we to make of another special occasion impacted by fear of a virus? It's a foregone conclusion that most, if not all of us are getting tired of something so tiny having such a big impact. It's been about two months now and we've gone through Palm Sunday, Easter, some college graduations and countless other more personal special occasions being messed up. Things like birthdays, anniversaries, weddings...and funerals. And now, it's Mothers Day's turn to be slighted.

But somehow, this just seems par for the course, doesn't it? I mean, how often does mom "take one for the team", like when there are 4 people and only 3 rolls left, it's mom who says "No thank you". Being sacrificial seems in many ways to come naturally to the role. And now we have a pandemic scare and it's mom who sacrifices again. In fact, health wise, it's not just on a certain day, but usually in everyday life.

Honestly, what did your mother (and most mothers for sure) do when you got sick or dirty or messy, (and I mean *REALLY* dirty or sick, as in the rest of the family clearing the room)? Who was the one who stepped up? Who was the one who rolled up *her* sleeves, held *her* nose and did what had to be done? Usually mom. Who was the one who put herself in the "hotzone" when you had a stomach bug? Who was the one who wiped up the snotty noses and other nasty stuff with barely a chance to wash her own hands? Usually mom.

On this day when we celebrate our mothers, maybe we should look at this particular sacrificial aspect of their characters to gain some lessons for our own. How willing are we to risk ourselves for others? I don't mean act foolishly without due consideration, but do we put ourselves out there when the going gets rough or risky?

There is no doubt Jesus did just that. When Jesus encountered the leper, He didn't say: "Hold on a minute; let me put on my mask and gloves." Compassion and empathy were out in front, even to the point of personal risk. (I know the comparison is not perfect, but you get the point). Does the Christ who lives in us more often lead us to

run **towards** the "fire" rather than away form it? With fear and panic and ignorance and arrogance running rampant in our country now, we cannot afford to forget, or put on the back burner the heart of compassion given to us by Jesus **and lived out before us in our mothers.**

So here's to the wipers of noses and coverers of coughs and the kissers of booboos. Thank you and Happy Mother's Day...from at least 6 feet away.
